### JOSIAH HINCKS CLINICS


There will be no Josiah Hincks Clinics in the Library until further notice.

### THE TAIL END



## VILLAGE HALL UPDATE

Careful management of the Village Hall has resulted in an amazing record of achievement in maintenance, improvement and sound finance. Last year, in addition to a number of smaller projects, big improvements included energy and cost saving solar panels, an essential connecting door from the Parish Office to the toilet and a refitted kitchen. The donation of a defibrillator for the village hall was gratefully received from an anonymous donor. Thanks to East Goscote electrics for fitting it free of charge.

## GOING FORWARD



£500 from Borough Councillor Laurie Needham through the Charnwood Members' grant scheme will help to fund a new boiler fitted in July 2020. Charnwood Borough Council recently installed Cycle Racks to the front of our hall to encourage active travel (see photo). We are looking at the installation of a new kitchen door and a new oven along with enhancements to the storage area.

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the village hall closed its doors in March 2020. The Management Committee applied unsuccessfully to Leicestershire County Council for funds to cover the loss of income. However, a government grant of £10,000 was obtained and therefore all lost income has been covered. Following Government guidelines, the hall reopened on June 8th for the Pre-school. We are contacting all our regular users to assess demand in July/August. The hall will remain closed for Party Bookings until 31st August.

Thanks to everyone who hires the hall, especially our regular users: Pocket Rocket Pre-School, Zumba, Christian Church, Tetsudo, Guides, Brownies, Parish Council, Weight Watchers, and all the party users. Thanks also to the members of the Management Committee who continue to work to offer the excellent facility that is the East Goscote Village Hall. However, she continued making a difference to the children and the residents of the care homes as regular contact is made using Zoom. Pocket Rocket, with the help of kind donations received from the local community, have already dropped treats off to the care home residents which have certainly put a smile on their faces. # THE WORD FROM THE CHURCH

Greetings to East Goscote from the other side of the red lockdown line here in Thurmaston. Just as we were planning to re-open the churches for prayer and then for services in the two villages the circumstances changed again. It has been a theme over these months, change and disruption. By the time the Long Furrow is out things may have changed again for the better. I certainly pray that they will.

We last met for worship in church on the 15th March, an incredible 15 weeks ago, it was the weekend before Mother's Day. Not meeting together for corporate worship has meant that the church has had to really consider what it is, and why it is here at all.

Of course we have been able to use technology to provide online services and to email weekly newsletters to the congregation, but not everyone has access to the internet. For the church members who don't do YouTube or email we have tried to stay in contact by posting newsletters. However the most effective way of keeping in touch is through phone calls. There has been a network of people making calls, sharing how they have been coping and supporting one another. At the church we have also been blessed by the very kind donation and installation of a replacement heating boiler by Mr Nunn who owns Ling Dale and Primrose Lodge care homes.

Staying in touch without meeting in person reminds us that the church is so much more than a building. In fact I think that we have rediscovered that the church exists whether there is a building or not. This was certainly the case in the early church of the 1st century after Jesus' life, death and resurrection. The building is of course important as a place for Christians to gather and as a community space, but it isn't the church, the church is the people.

So when we say St Hilda's, what we really mean is the group of people who share a common faith and hope in Jesus Christ the Son of God. A people who care for one another and who turn to God in times of crisis for guidance and hope. That care has also been demonstrated in the wider community of East Goscote through the Covid-19 Volunteer group set up by Councillor Laurie Needham. We are still here if you need us. Many in our community have been helping family, friends and neighbours through this crisis too. I am sure that this will strengthen an already great community.

It has been a time of crisis for the whole nation, for the world. Many are struggling financially, and of course, many have lost a relative or a friend to this disease. It would be easy and perhaps understandable for people to lay the blame for this crisis at God's door. Why couldn't he have prevented it? It is a question that people of faith have wrestled with down the centuries and it is an important question. The honest answer is that we don't know why God seems to have abandoned us to this virus. But like the way he sent his son to be alongside us all those years ago, to suffer and to die, we know that God is still with us in this crisis. He identifies with us, his creation, and longs to speak with us and hear from us through His word the Bible, and through our prayers. It is the responsibility of the church, as well as supporting one another to offer the world the hope that we share. That hope is that there is a God who cares for us and stands alongside us in difficult times and waits to welcome us home one day, to be with him in a place of safety. There is a wonderful promise in the book of Revelation which speaks of this, "He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away."

I hope and pray that you are keeping safe and perhaps when all of this is over we can meet in church to celebrate the hope that the church declares.

Recently a letter from Cathy Duffy announced her retirement through ill health from all East Goscote committees. Cathy represented the village as Borough Councillor for two terms of office and more recently as a Parish Councillor as well as Chairing the Village Hall Committee and Neighbourhood Watch. She lived in Rothley and supported East Goscote wholeheartedly throughout the time that she was involved in the village. The Parish Council thanked her for the work over the years and wish her well for the future.

# THE GREENER GOSCOTE PAGE

COVID-19 continues to affect every aspect of our lives, It does limit collective projects and get together so some of our energy is diverted into Covid-19 Community Support. Our Facebook Group keeps us in touch and there is lots of helping each other out.

Our work at the village **RECYCLING CENTRE** has been needed even more than usual. Pubs being shut, charity shops closed and clothing collections suspended has resulted in record deposits at the bottle, can and clothing banks. Good to see.

There has been a downside to this. Tip closures and bulky and garden waste suspensions have resulted in some difficult flytip offences being committed. Not wishing to harp on the negative but just to be clear, the Recycling Centre is located on Jelson land and managed by the Parish Council. The day-to-day work is carried out mainly by Greener Goscote volunteers. If we want to hang on to this useful facility we need to keep it tidy with no flytips or overflows.



## Here's a reminder of what can be recycled there:

- Paper & cardboard (no polystyrene, plastic bags or straps)
- Glass bottles & jars (you can leave your tops on !)
- Drinks cans, Textiles, clothing, shoes etc.

If the bank is full, take your stuff home and try a bit later. We monitor constantly but there's sometimes a few days delay while contractors respond so no overflows please. We know where you live !

**OUR BID FOR FUNDING** from Central England Co-operative Community Dividend was successful. Many thanks to the Co-op for this grant which will help us get established. You will start to see a more professional presence of Greener Goscote as we go about our work and a wider range of projects to make our village even greener.



We try to keep our village beautiful. Our planned Great British Spring Clean litter pick had to be rescheduled to become part of the Tidy Britain Great British September Clean (between 11th and 27th September, date to be finalised). And we squeezed in a socially distanced litter pick on 5th July trying out our new Hi-Viz courtesy of the Co-op.

**CLIMATE CRISIS** hasn't gone away. After this is over, we must try to make sure that it is not just back to business as usual and that some real change for the better occurs. Greener Goscote will be there to play a part. If you are interested in joining us, check out the Greener Goscote Facebook Page. This is mostly how we communicate with the rest of the planet. New members of any age are welcome, especially young people. (Children under 16 can get involved under direct supervision of a parent or guardian.) No membership fee is required but donations are invited. Most of all, your imagination, skills and energy are needed. As Greta nearly said, "No village is too small to make a difference".

## SPEEDING WITH COUNCILLOR NELSON

Speeding, unfortunately, is a regular cause for concern for villagers. Stretches of straight road on Long Furrow and Melton Road often see dangerous drivers speeding, taking the traffic calming measures at speed and even crossing onto the opposite carriageway having misjudged the pedestrian islands.

In the last year, due to a low turn out of volunteers for the annual speed watch, we decided on another course of action that may help to raise awareness of the speed limits.

- We have purchased banners, designed by a villager, which are attached to bus shelters and regularly moved to remain eye catching.
- We have supplied residents on Long Furrow, Chestnut Way and Melton Road with '20s Plenty' bin stickers, encouraging drivers to further limit their speed below the speed limit where people live.
- We are purchasing new signs for the village entry points with a clear speed reduction message.

As always, we welcome Speeding Operations undertaken by Leicestershire Police. The most recent operation in June on Melton Road saw:

- 38 vehicles travelling below 30 mph
- 23 vehicles travelling between 30-35 mph
- 4 vehicles travelling between 36-41 mph\*
- 3 vehicles travelling between 42-45 mph\*\*

\*If the person is caught doing between 30 to 42 then they could get £100 fine and 3 points BUT if they have a clean licence and have not undertaken a Speed Awareness course previously, then they could be offered this option instead. This decision is made by a Traffic process unit.

\*\*If they are travelling over 42 miles per hour then they are dealt with by the Court who make the decisions on what penalty they are given. 
