LOCAL PATIENTS ADVISED TO USE THE MOST APPROPRIATE SERVICE

With NHS services across Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland experiencing very high demand, we're being advised of the best routes to take to get the medical help we need.

The three Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs), University Hospitals of Leicester NHS Trust and East Midlands Ambulance Service are reminding us that hospital emergency departments are for potentially life threatening emergencies and very serious conditions.

If you don't have this type of condition – in other words if it's urgent but not life-threatening - you are likely to experience long waiting times whilst also increasing demand on services.

Instead, you could be getting better sooner by using another local service.

NHS 111

You will be directed to 111 if you call your normal GP service out-of-hours, but 111 is available 24/7. If you've called 111 you will be assessed by a team of highly trained call advisors and clinicians. Depending on your condition you could receive a home visit from an Out of Hours GP or one of any number of other outcomes based on your telephone assessment. You can also visit 111.nhs.uk.

Urgent Care Centres

Urgent Care Centres (in Leicestershire County and Rutland) and Health Care Hubs (in Leicester City) are run



by healthcare professionals and many have x-ray facilities. They can deal with a range of health issues including sprains, suspected fractures and breaks, minor head injuries, cuts and grazes, minor scalds and burns, ear and throat infections and more.

Community Pharmacies

Pharmacists are highly trained clinicians. They can give expert advice on common illnesses including coughs, colds, aches and pains and they can answer questions about prescribed medicines. They can also advise on treatment of minor injuries and many have private consultation rooms.

Self Care

You can be prepared to treat minor illness and injury at home using a well-stocked stocked medicine cabinet.

You can find more self-care advice on the CCG website: www.leicestercityccg.nhs.uk/self-care

Professor Fahad Rizvi, GP and Urgent Care Lead for LLR, said: "By knowing more about the different health services available and what they offer, you can get yourself and your family the right treatment much faster.

"As a GP, I know that when my practice is busy, some of my patients aren't sure what to do when they need immediate health advice or care, but it's not a 999 emergency. There are a range of alternative services available locally. By phoning NHS 111 you will still be able to speak to a GP or other clinician whenever you need to, and they will be able to get the care that you need."

NHS 111 is free and gives confidential health guidance and advice, 24 hours a day 365 days a year.

Run by Derbyshire Health United, they will also direct you to other local services where appropriate.

The flu tended to leave adults 'sagging in the middle and feeling very low spirited. But, somehow things carried on. And it ought not to be out of place to specially praise all tradesmen and the lads and lasses delivering newspapers, who did their daily rounds against the hazards of snow, ice, frozen fingers and... FLU.

In this noble band, we must include Mrs Betty Simpson and Mrs Elizabeth Woolman; our post ladies. They were first class in plodding from Syston through the snow with their heavy loads of mail.

LONG FURROW, 25 YEARS AGO... ADVICE FROM MAHIVIR MEDICAL CENTRE

Like the whole of Leicestershire, our village has been hit by the Winter Virus which is persisting and causing Flu like illness, persistent cough, tiredness and fever. Our advice to you is to take Paracetamol, drink plenty of fluids and, if the fever is not settling, cool yourself with cold sponging. Use any cough mixture for relief of the cough (our chemist is always helpful in advising which to buy). Rest is the key to recovery from viruses. Antibiotics don't work and they decrease your bodies power to combat the viruses. Of course, if in doubt, please see your doctor. Our patients are mostly seen the same day if they ring and make an appointment.


EAST GOSCOTE - A GREAT PLACE TO

New Councillors

No new councillors have been co-opted since the last report so we now have three Parish Councillor vacancies which we would very much like to fill. Applications are invited from women and men of all ages who are keen to serve the community in this way. Contact the Parish Clerk for details.

In October...

Defibrillator training took place in the Village Hall on the 22nd. Thirteen volunteers came from local football teams, village hall users and Parish Councillors. The general feeling from volunteers was that the event was very helpful.

Councillors Needham and Nelson investigated ways of slowing drivers down using "20's Plenty Bin Stickers" in key areas – possibly Ling Dale and Long Furrow. Councillor Nelson offered to visit residents with a view to asking them to apply the stickers to their wheelie bins. Also banners will be appearing at various locations around the village asking drivers to "Stay at 30".

November saw...

Eighty lamp-post poppies put up by Councillor Webbon and our Caretaker for Remembrance Day. Councillors Duffy and Needham attended the Remembrance Service at St Hilda's Church.

New Play area signs have been installed on the Mound and Village Green sites. Councillor Nelson and volunteers planted bulbs around the tennis court on the 24th November. And a copse area of 30 trees provided by the Woodland Trust will be planted in the spring in the dog walk area.

December...

Brought the installation of the village Christmas lights.

A second village defibrillator was fitted to the Village Hall, the money having been donated by an anonymous donor. Thanks to East Goscote Electrics for installing the defibrillator free of charge.

PCSO 6098 Lesley Richards was recently appointed to her post to replace our previous PCSO, Matt Harburt.

The Parish Council considered its response to the Charnwood Draft Local Plan 2019-2036 consultation. The council agreed to use the services of a planning expert to assist with our very detailed response to this important consultation.

On Saturday the 14th of December, just under forty villagers attended an afternoon tea in the village hall served by the Brownies. The residents were entertained by the Brownies singing carols, Paul Smith DJ, a trio of musicians and Queniborough choir. The Brownies held a draw for a Christmas raffle with the proceeds going to library funds. Thanks to Councillors Martin Webbon and Laurie Needham, along with Mr Nick Shivers for planning the event.

A Resilience Project meeting is to be held in early 2020. Resilience is intended to prepare our initial response to events such as flooding until the emergency services take over.

East Goscote Village Hall Report: December 2019

To begin: Party bookings are looking very healthy over the winter period and also for the coming New Year!

As an update: The Committee have purchased 6 x new 6' x 2'6" plastic tables to replace the heavy wooden trestle tables.

Currently, we are now looking at the costs of replacing the Village Hall blinds, and a new outside light has been fitted by the kitchen door. All important jobs that needed to be carried out have also been done.

A defibrillator was fitted at the front of the Village Hall and this was fitted "free of charge" by East Goscote Electrics on 21st November 2019. **The defibrillator was kindly donated to the village by an anonymous donor!**

A new boiler is scheduled to be fitted in the Village Hall in early April 2020 (unless it breaks down before this date).

Finally, I would like to thank all of the Members of the Village Hall Management Committee for generously offering their time and support, and I would also like to take this opportunity of wishing you all a very Happy New Year. May peace, love, and prosperity follow you always!

I'm in the process of starting to write my community safety partnership update for January 2020 this evening, looking at the overall picture I'm really please to say that overall crime is down in Charnwood. The teams are briefed tonight and already out and about dealing with incidents however we are already looking forward to next year and planning on how we will decrease crime and anti social behaviour and importantly increase residents confidence in your local police in Charnwood.

In relation to crime over the past few weeks, we saw an increase in vehicle related crime especially the theft of catalytic converters from Toyota and Mercedes vehicles. This thankfully has slowed down locally, other neighbourhood areas are still having reported offences however I like to think that the team here have been



visible, the public have been listening to messages we have been generating and together we have made a difference. We have made some really significant arrests of late concerning those criminals involved in burglary offences, drug related offences as well as working hard with partners to deal with anti Social Behaviour in the borough.

In the new year I will be intensifying my efforts to promote neighbourhood link, I've fallen short of my ambitious 10,000 members in Charnwood however I will get there. Please speak to neighbours and friends in Charnwood, it would be great if you could spread the word about this facility which we will be using ever more frequently moving into next year.

Charnwood Watch update - we managed to secure funding for Charnwood Watch, there were a few delays in respect of signs and related items however I'm confident that this will launch in January 2020. I have designated PCSO Lisa McNeill to the project as well as Sgt Chris Wharton, I'm looking forward to seeing how this watch scheme spreads across the borough. As I have said before, this isn't meant to encroach on existing NW schemes which have been running for years locally, I hope we can work along side each other and share crime prevention info on this forum Clearly this is why I'm keen to sign as many people up as possible so the crime prevention messages reach far and wide.

I don't know why the NL system asks members to rate messages, I don't wish to be rude however I may place a full stop in the wrong place which clearly infuriates some.

Also please don't use NL to report crime, 101,999 or online please.

Finally, please have a safe and peaceful evening and I hope 2020 is everything you wish for it to be.
