

hard work in the area prior to his retirement. James hopes to continue this good work.



New additions the to library are bound COMMUNITY NEWS full sets of and LONG FURROW magazines. The Parish Council have paid Paul Dodge to bind these magazines as an everlasting record for the village of East Goscote. These volumes are for reference only and are not to be taken from the library.

The Parish Council continues to support the library and the Long Furrow Magazine. This year they have donated £1000 to assist in the running of this community facility, and £400 to the production of the Long Furrow.



The library and East Goscote Parish Council have carried out separate surveys

about the readership of Long Furrow. The library survey showed that 88 households out of 96 responders did read the magazine. The survey on the village app showed that 123 households out of 146 did read the magazine. Both sets of figures indicate that Long Furrow deserves the support of the parish council.

The Parish Council continue to work with the library and, once again, the library will be hosting a Christmas event on the same date as the Christmas Tree Fair at St Hilda's. The council have donated Christmas presents for Santa to distribute.

Some residents may have noticed the three new bus shelters on Melton Road. The one opposite Watergate has been paid for by your Parish Council; the other two adjacent to Rearsby Roses have been bought using Section 106 money given by David Wilson. We are looking to replace the one adjacent to Broome Avenue next.

Due to requests from residents, the parish council have remarked the disabled bays on the Merchants Common car-park. Users of the car-park are requested not to use these bays unless they are Blue Badge holders.

The Tennis Court continues to be well used. Unfortunately, some people have been climbing over the fence and damaging it. This misdemeanour is dangerous and anyone who falls whilst climbing it, risks serious injury. The cost of any damage to the fence comes out of village rates.

The Village Hall is to have a new roof. The cost of the replacement will come from Village Hall reserves, a donation from the parish council and a variety of other grants.





Wreake and Soar Valley AC break the tape for 200

Wreake and Soar Valley AC have broken the 200 membership mark for the first time just part way through their affiliation period making them one of the biggest running and athletics clubs in the county. Breaking the barrier has meant that membership has increased by over 40% over the past two years.

John Skevington who founded the club commented "Having 200 members is almost, for me, unbelievable and the number is sure to grow further as traditionally our numbers grow again in September when the cross country season begins. Our success is very much due to the commitment of the volunteers who give up their time to drive the club forward"

The club, from small beginnings has risen to become a prominent and well known club nationally winning titles at the Midland and national road relays and by also gaining medals at the National Cross country championships. Locally the squad continue to perform well on all surfaces and April saw the club take the first five age group team places in the Livingston Relays. Its athletes are are currently enjoying a highly successful track season with several in the top echelons of the East Midlands rankings and at the time of writing two in the top ten in the UK.

The club made a huge step forward in its athlete provision this year by offering its performance athletes an overseas warm weather training camp in Spain with a follow up planned for early in 2018. Other highlights have been invitations to the World trial's 10,000m in London where the team won the overall competition in a junior 10,000m relay closely matching the winners time in the main men's race and to the Manchester international where the team performed well winning medals in a series of relays and field events prior to the International athletics. An invitation has been received to attend the Manchester Games again this year.

The club has boosted its membership with a growing number of adult runners who enjoy a Saturday morning session from the Saturday training HQ at Wreake

Academy in Syston at the same time as the junior session takes place. A new "couch to 51," horingers running programme

to 5k" beginners running programme will be starting on September 2nd which again will boost memberships.

John Skevington further remarked "although we are obviously proud of the achievements of our performance athletes we always offer a welcoming and nurturing environment to all of our members regardless of age or ability. Our move to the Ratcliffe college track for our midweek sessions has made a huge difference to our training regime and I am sure with the support and environment that we offer that we will continue to grow both in success and numbers"

These coins in a white purse take the form of 1, 2, 3, 4 penny pieces the sum of which equals the Monarchs age. This year 91 pieces of silver coins (nine sets of 10p and 1 penny). The red purse contained a £5 coin and a 50 coin. Historically (started in 1662) Charles II this money is for clothing and provisions.


Garage and Shed Security

Dear Residents of East Goscote,

Crime is something that we can all try to keep at bay and it's so important that we remain vigilant and be aware of suspicious activity in the village. For this edition of the Long Furrow I wanted to pass on crime prevention advice on the subject of garages and Sheds.

Garages and sheds are vulnerable to burglary, as they are generally quite flimsy structures, but they should not be forgotten. They are often the first places that a burglar will target, because they provide a ready source of tools and implements for breaking into the main house.

Garages and sheds also have lawnmowers, bikes and other valuables that are easy to steal and costly to replace. By fitting additional security to garages and sheds, burglars will find it more difficult to break in and they will have to make more noise doing so. A few simple security measures can increase the visual deterrent and reduce the likelihood of garages and sheds being targeted.



To contact the Police for non-emergencies and to report crime call 101, and always call 999 for emergencies. Crime can also be reported on-line. Please log onto the Leics Police force website for lots of information on this and further information on your local Police www.leics.police.uk

- Garages and Sheds are often the first places a burglar will target; metal up-and-over garage doors can be secured with additional purpose made locks fitted to either side, approximately 300mm up from the floor, to reduce the leverage points
- An external floor mounted, solid steel locking 'T' bar with a closed shackle padlock, will offer a good visual deterrent and make it difficult to force the door open
- Wooden garage double doors can be secured with two substantial hasps and staples and closed shackle padlocks, one towards the top and one towards the bottom.
- Garage side or rear doors can be secured with British Standard 5-lever mortice locks and two internal mortice rack bolts, one towards the top and one towards the bottom to reduce the leverage points
- Shed doors can be secured with two substantial hasps and staples and two closed shackle padlocks on the outside, one towards the top and one towards the bottom. External hinge screws should be replaced with one-way clutch head screws to prevent them being removed and access gained this way
- Garage and shed windows can be secured with internal diamond mesh grilles, which provide a good visual deterrent to opportunistic burglariesGgarden tools and ladders should be secured by wrapping a substantial chain around them and padlocking them to an eyebolt which has been secured to the floor or wall. This will prevent them being stolen or used to break into the house
- Tools and garden implements should be visibly property marked with the postcode and house name or number, to deter theft and assist police with identifying the rightful owner


The general consensus was that fun was had by all and off the back of the open day the club will be running junior and adult beginners courses on Sunday afternoons during July.

LOVE FOOD, HATE WASTE ! That pretty much sums me up. I'm a Master Composter and a Waste Action Volunteer for Leicestershire Waste Partnership and as such I was lucky enough to get myself onto a Love Food Hate Waste refresher course held at Brocks Hill Visitor Centre in Oadby. (Now there's another good place to take the kids which doesn't cost the Earth, so to speak.) We learned and re-learned all manner of hints and tips on how to reduce the amount of food waste. As well as being an easy and fascinating way to be greener, this stuff can save you an absolute bomb ! £60 quid a month of savings is possible for an average household.

Check out their wonderful website www. lovefoodhatewaste.com full of recipes and practical advice. I'll just pass on two little gems. The only food date you need to act on is USE BY. If there is a USE BY date, the safety of that food cannot be relied on after it and it should then be disposed of. BEST BEFORE dates are advisory so the quality may be slightly reduced but the food is not unsafe. There is one exception to this. The BEST BEFORE date on eggs should really be regarded as USE BY. DISPLAY UNTIL dates are just about stock control for the retailer. Second little gem - a lot of bread is wasted. If you find you are wasting bread due to mould, try splitting fresh bread into bags and freezing some. And don't feed too much bread to the birds because, as the big bike shop in Hunstanton clearly states, "Fat Birds Can't Fly"!

CHECK OUT YOUR FOOD BEFORE

YOU TRAVEL Still on the subject of food waste (after all it represents about a quarter by weight of the average black bin) and with the holiday season upon us, the Hubbub Foundation have come up with timely advice for saving money and treading more lightly upon the planet. Fees have crept up a little over the 13 years since they were introduced but at £28 a year by direct debit, it's still surely a bargain to save the mess in the car and the queue at the tip. I don't know how many thousand brown bins there are out there but people leave the Borough and move in, drop out and move house so little surprise they need to survey who has paid and where they live again. Visit www.charnwood. gov.uk/pages/garden_waste_stickers or call 01509 634563 to re-register, receive a bin sticker and continue to have your garden waste collected and composted.

COMPOST CORNER AT THF GREEN PLACE 6 Cossington Road Sileby (next door to Chine House Vets) is home to my home composting demonstration. The Green Place is a lovely oasis for all the family to explore. There's a Fairtrade Café, ethical gift shop, cosy yurt, wildlife garden, craft days, workshops, events, outdoor films, treehouse hideaway, second-hand books etc. The great thing for us at East Goscote is that all this is just a few minutes away so it doesn't cost the Earth.
