

BRIDGE THAT GAP (COMMUNITY NEWS 1972)

Ever since East Goscote has had inhabitants to worry about amenity problems - and a Parish Council to solve them - the bridge over Queniborough brook has been high on the list for attention.

Leicester County Council estimates the work will cost about £3,000.

The Queniborough bridge has had a chequered history: any alterations to it now will not be the first. Traffic of one sort or another has been using Melton to Leicester road since the 14th century: times when Grantham and Melton were experiencing prosperity.

When the bridge over Queniborough brook was first built is uncertain but a bridge is marked on J Priors map of Leicestershire; and this was published in 1779.

Rearsby's bridge was built in 1777, if this any guide. Because the volume of wheeled traffic had been steadily building up, Trusts known as Turnpike Trusts were established to assist local parishes maintain and improve the roads. In 1767 the Melton to Leicester Turnpike road - as it was called - came in for some of this improvement. A bridge over Queniborough could have been built as a result of this with tolls being collected somewhere along the road to finance the work.

These tolls must have initially yielded quite well. For in 1824 our bridge was re-built (The bridge over Syston's Brook had to be re-built years before, in 1797, and it only took nine days. Hence its local nickname: the nine-day's wonder!). Whether such speedy rebuilding involved a lot of overtime, the history books do not say. But they do show that in 1836 the Turnpike Trust spent £1,800 repairing the Melton to Leicester Road and only received £1,246 from Tolls. A familiar state of affairs!

The size of horse-drawn carriages was inevitably increasing all the while, and simple passing - and overtaking - was causing horse riders growing frustration, particularly at Queniborough bridge!

The County felt obliged to widen it in 1874, so once again the brickies moved in.

Almost one hundred years later the situation is no less acute.

Even during the last war our bridge caused a few grey hairs; it's rigidity was doubted.

In 1941, the County Surveyor reported the bridge showed signs of collapse because of the great activity at the Ordinance Depot here and a temporary bridge would have to be constructed.

£20 was paid for the loss of grazing rights and the temporary addition appeared on the Queniborough village side; providing two bridges! For some time the one we now use was closed-off for strengthening and the one we cannot now use was used! After the war, a decision had to be made about the future of this temporary bridge: it was declared redundant on all counts and closed. The land being purchased by the County in 1952 for £50.

A permanent dual-carriageway bridge system was obviously not considered vital.

The unfortunate fact for East Goscote's pedestrians is that the site of the war-time bridge is on the wrong side the road. Otherwise, a simple bridge could easily be provided there.

As it is, the County Council is having to design a sectional footbridge. This will be pre-fabricated and hauled into Position on the downstream -East Goscote - side "sometime during this financial year."

When the work will actually commence is not yet known. The Department of the Environment has first to give monetary approval but an inspired guess points to the last quarter of 1972.

In the meantime, mothers and children will have to continue to brave the traffic brushing past.

Villagers must hope the County Council will be enabled to undertake this work as soon as possible. Before the other sort of Undertaker has to be called out rather suddenly one day!

JAMES POLAND'S EAST GOSCOTE ANNUAL REPORT 2022

The last 12 months have again been dominated by covid-19 and its wider effects on society. The roll out of the vaccine has meant that the link between people getting covid and people subsequently being hospitalised with it has been broken, and that in turn led to the reducing and finally removal of restrictions we've seen since. Leicestershire County Council has been supporting communities throughout this time, including through supporting vaccination clinics, get vaccinated campaigns and through community grants such as the Shires Grant Scheme which has been hugely popular. The last two years have hugely tested Leicestershire County Council (particularly the Public Health Team led by Director of Public Health Mike Sandys), but I believe we've weathered the storm well.

The pandemic has undoubtedly had a major impact on the County's finances however and as Leicestershire was already the lowest funded County in the country the impact on us is especially acute. In order to help the fairer funding campaign, Leicestershire County Council has got together with the other 19 lowest funded authorities in the country to put pressure on government to reform local government funding. This group of authorities, known as the F20 Group, ultimately want fairer funding reform but as a first step is asking for a base level of funding for the lowest funded authorities to ensure the lowest funded authorities can at least improve their situation at a relatively smaller cost to central government. There is no question funding is the number one challenge Leicestershire County Council faces and it's therefore something we are doing our best to challenge for reform.

In May 2021 I was honoured to be re-elected to serve as the County Councillor for Syston Fosse, I'd like to thank everyone

who supported me and since then I've very much continued the job of working hard for everyone in the Division and being Syston Fosse's voice at County Hall. As part of that role since last June I've served as a Scrutiny Commissioner, examining the work of the County's Cabinet as well as what Leicestershire County Council is doing more broadly. This is effectively being a critical friend to help improve policy and performance at Leicestershire County Council.

In East Goscote I've worked on matters ranging from helping local businesses with various issues, speed reduction schemes on Melton Road and Broome Lane, speaking against the Gladman development at Plans Committee last August, improving green spaces in the village and a huge range of other matters for residents who have needed my help.

I'd like to finish this year's report by thanking the Parish Council and Village Clerk Liz Pizer for all the work they do for the village. I work very closely with them and see the commitment they show to making East Goscote a great place to live. I'd also like to thank Borough Councillor Laurie Needham for the work she does for the village, as well as Ed Argar MP with whom I work closely for residents.

YOUR COUNCIL TAX PRECEPT 2022/23 EXPLAINED



YOUR COUNCIL TAX PRECEPT EXPLAINED

The primary source of income for most Parish Councils comes from the Precept, part of the Council Tax. We hope to explain the contribution you make to the Parish Council through your Council tax and how it is spent.

WHAT IS A PRECEPT?

The Parish Council receives a small proportion of the local Council Tax. It does not receive any direct funding from Central Government. The funding collected pays for the running of the Council and the services it provides.

HOW IS IT CALCULATED?

The Parish Council makes an estimate of income and expenditure for the next financial year, including some for future planned projects and/or unexpected events. It is then calculated as an amount per Council Tax Band D Property and added to the Council Tax Bill of all the dwellings within the Parish area.

HOW IS IT RAISED?

Charnwood Borough Council collects your Council Tax on behalf of the Borough Council, County Council, Police, Fire and the precepts for any Parish/Town Councils in their district. It is important to note that East Goscote Parish Council's precept is just a small percentage of your overall Council Tax Bill.

HOW MUCH IS IT?

This year, there is an increase in the precept charge to East Goscote residents. From April 2022, the cost per average household (Band D property) has increased from £62.99 to £67.18 per annum. Our total budget for 2022/2023 amounts to £82,520, however using some of our reserves we can reduce our requirement to £63,000. This figure is divided by the Council Tax Base (937.8) to arrive at £67.18 per Band D property.

HOW IS IT SPENT?

Your precept is spent on maintaining the provision of all facilities and services the Parish Council offers as shown in the graphic.

VILLAGE IMPROVEMENTS

During the next year (2022/23) we are holding a Queens Jubilee community event, repairing the tarmac to the multi sports court on the playing fields, and are re-surfacing the swings on Lilac Way due to root damage.

We hope to continue to maintain our village to the highest standards, whilst keeping costs as low as possible.




