



EAST GOSCOTE VILLAGE HALL IS AVAILABLE TO HIRE




As well as being available for occasional use, we have the opportunity for regular users to have weekly use of the Village Hall.

Application to build houses on Rearsby border returns

Residents of Rearsby and East Goscote were shocked to see plans return to build on land off Melton Road. The proposed site is at the 'Cow Field' on the border with East Goscote and would see 56 houses built on this important green buffer between the two villages, which is a valued green space and walking spot for many. Almost identical applications have been refused twice in both 2015 and 2017, including by an independent government inspector at Appeal in 2018.

Rearsby Parish Council and local volunteers mounted a doorstep campaign to enable as many residents as possible to have their say on the plans.

Many residents in East Goscote share concerns and have lodged their own objections.

Laurie, Chris and Sandra are also available to help people with queries about the application and will be speaking against the proposed development when this goes to Plans Committee (currently scheduled for November).

Village Nature Project

We were pleased to join the guided nature walks in the village this summer, organised by the Parish Council, with the support of Greener Goscote, and funded through an external grant. It was fascinating to learn about just how much wildlife and plant life there is around the village and why and how this can be preserved and enhanced.

More information about the project can be found elsewhere in this edition of Long Furrow, so if you are interested, please get involved. We are looking forward the Homes for Hibernators craft workshop on Saturday 25th November and the upcoming Hedgehog Streets project.

Broome Lane, traffic concerns

We have been contacted by residents living on Broome Lane about the speed of some cars on this road. This is a long-standing problem and one which needs a lasting solution. There have also been reports of HGV's regularly using this route and concerns that this may become worse when construction of new developments in the area begins.

Laurie has been in touch with the police about what steps could be taken to prevent HGV's using the road, if there could be better signage and

possible deterrents to the speeding.

Please contact us if you have further reports/information that we can pass on.

Banking hub opens in Syston

A lot of people in East Goscote use Syston as the main shopping and service centre and in recent years, the demise of banking services has impacted many.

We were, therefore, very pleased to see that a new banking hub has opened. It will be temporarily sited in Syston Community Centre and is open Mon-Fri 9.30am-4.30am, with a view to moving into the old Santander unit as a permanent hub in the future. The hub was set up by Cash Access UK which is an organisation seeking to ensure that people have access to cash. The Post Office will run the counter where customers of any bank can carry out day to day transactions. If people need to speak to a representative from their own bank, the following banks will be available on a rotating basis:

- Monday Santander
- Tuesday Natwest
- Wednesday Lloyds (afternoon only)
- Thursday HSBC
- Friday Barclays.



A MESSAGE FROM RT. HON EDWARD ARGAR MP FOR CHARNWOOD

It was a pleasure to join local councillors and local residents at St Hilda's Church in East Goscote recently for the service to install the new vicar of Syston and East Goscote, Revd Ros Harper, in her role and to welcome her to the area. It was a moving service, with a big turnout to mark the start of her ministry for local people.

Another development which will benefit people is East Goscote was the recent opening of the Banking Hub in its temporary home in the Community Centre in nearby Syston, before it moves to its permanent home in the town later this year. Recent years have seen the local bank branches in Syston close down, leaving the town and surrounding villages without a bank within easy walking distance. While the local Post Office does a fantastic job of providing some banking services, there was a clear need for a banking hub - a location which could house the major banks on a rota basis, providing face-to-face access for people to their bank in a local location.

The delivery of this Banking Hub is great news for Syston, East Goscote, and the surrounding villages, and is down to a lot of work, by a lot of people, over a number of years. As the local MP I have been campaigning for this Hub since 2021, and working with partners to deliver it, most recently early this

summer brokering a meeting in Syston with the Town Council and Cash Access UK (who set up the hub) to find ways to overcome remaining obstacles to delivering the Hub.

Alongside Cash Access UK, huge credit must go to Syston Town Council and it's former Chair and current Chair, Cllrs Tom Barkley



and Mark Cherry, Town Manager Catherine Voyce, former Borough Councillors (and current Town Cllr) Sue Gerrard and Simon Bradshaw who campaigned hard and determinedly for this hub, the team at the local Post Office, and many others, who should all, rightly, be proud of this collective achievement, and without whom it wouldn't have happened.

The Hub is open Monday to Friday, 9:30am to 4:30pm, with staff from Santander being available on Mondays, NatWest on Tuesdays, Lloyds on Wednesday afternoons, HSBC on Thursdays, and Barclays on Fridays.

WOULD YOU LIKE TO SEE THE CREATION OF AN ELECTRIC CAR CLUB IN EAST GOSCOTE?

The Parish Council is considering establishing an electric car club in conjunction with Green Fox Community Energy Cooperative, a local not-for-profit organisation who have secured funding to develop four electric car clubs in Leicestershire.

An electric car club allows users to access an electric vehicle without owning one and can offer a flexible, cost-effective alternative to private car ownership or leasing.

Initially we think this could be very beneficial to our community; as it would reduce emissions, assist people who don't own a car, help with reduced public transport, and help tackle the cost-of-living crisis. As part of the project, fast charging points would be installed in our village.

How does it work?

Residents pay a monthly membership fee and an hourly rate to hire a car. A member books the car, picks it up from a dedicated parking bay, drives it and returns it to the start location at the end of their hire.

What's next?

At this early stage we need to discover if residents would be interested in using an electric car club, so the Parish Council would like to gather feedback through a resident's survey. Ideally, we would like as many people as possible to complete the survey, as the larger the response, the more representative the sample. Please use the QR Code to access this. OUT AND ABOUT

Melton Road flower bed has been adopted by the Village Hall Management Committee and has been replanted. Many thanks to VHMC. Look out for a new "kissing gate" at the entrance to the playing fields. Quotes have been sought. Charnwood Borough Council have surveyed The Mound and we await feedback.

OPPORTUNITIES

Tennis court bookings and other phone app facilities are now via the website. The App is no longer being provided due to a software issue. A rare opportunity has arisen to hire the village hall on a regular basis. The VHMC have also acquired two table tennis tables for hirers to use. A new floor was fitted in the summer along with a new sound system. And would you like to be involved in a steering group to set up a village Electric Car Club? See separate article for details. We are also looking for a volunteer tree warden. If you are interested in this, please contact the office (see separate advert).

ENVIRONMENT

Our volunteer flood warden attended an event and has lots of information available. Please contact the office if you have any questions about flooding. A dog warden will be visiting our village green and playing fields (see separate article). He will be offering dog bags where needed and speaking to dog owners about the importance of cleaning up after their dogs and keeping them under control. The Reaching People Environment Fund / Leicestershire and Rutland Community Foundation have funded an ecological survey of the village, three guided walks (two great walks down, one to go in the Spring) and a Hedgehog Streets project. And look out for a Homes for Hibernators craft workshop in the Pavilion on Saturday 25th November, 2.00 p.m. - 4.00 p.m. Greener Goscote (GG) volunteers organised rakeathons of the Long Furrow brookside Wildlife Verge following an early strim and the end of season mow. BECOME A VOLUNTEER TREE WARDEN FOR EAST GOSCOTE

The Parish Council is currently looking to appoint a volunteer tree warden. Tree wardens are volunteers who play an active role in conserving trees and woods in their communities.

Tree Wardens plant, protect and promote their local trees. The types of activities that tree wardens can get involved in include:

- surveying local trees and gathering information about them
- liaising with the local community
- protecting trees and woods
- organising activities, such as planting and caring for new trees.

No training or experience in tree management is needed – just a love of trees and a few hours to spare. You will be able to join the Leicestershire Network of Tree Wardens who organise training and social events for Tree Wardens as well as offering practical support and advice.

Give hedgehogs access to your garden with 13cm x 13cm square Hedgehog Highways in or under your fence, and encourage neighbours to do the same.

GARDEN FOR HEDGEHOGS

Wildlife features like log piles, leaf piles, compost heaps and an undisturbed 'wild patch' will provide shelter and insect food for hedgehogs.

MAKE YOUR GARDEN SAFE

Remove hazards like litter, netting and chemicals, and check thoroughly before strimming and mowing. Ensure ponds have a sloped side or escape ramp for any hedgehogs that fall in.

BED AND BREAKFAST

Hedgehog houses can be bought online or built with our instructions. Supplementary food is also a great way to help – meaty cat or dog food and a shallow dish of water!




HOMES FOR HIBERNATORS EVENT

- Dangerous activities are not permitted including Trail Biking, Quad Biking, Golf and Horse Riding.




